Spring is in the Air for W.J. Maloney Plumbing, Heating & Cooling As New Chicago Cubs Spring Training Complex Opens

(MESA, Ariz.) W.J. Maloney Plumbing, Heating & Cooling has announced the completion of the company's work on Cubs Park in Mesa. This coincides with the opening of the new spring training home of the Chicago Cubs.

W.J. Maloney Plumbing, Heating & Cooling's work on the 14-month design/assist project included gas, water, waste and vent, and rain-water piping on the stadium, clubhouse, practice fields, maintenance building and batting tunnels.

Cubs Park, with an attendance capacity of 15,000, will host 16 Cactus League spring training games through the end of March.

Hunt Construction Group served as the general contractor.

Cubs Park's completion adds another feather in the ball cap of W.J. Maloney Plumbing, Heating & Cooling.

The company also worked on the Los Angeles Dodgers portion of the Camelback Ranch Spring Training Complex in Glendale, Ariz., which is shared by the Dodgers and the Chicago White Sox. W.J. Maloney Plumbing, Heating & Cooling's work there included gas, water, waste and vent, and rain-water piping. A five-acre lake, located between the Dodgers' and White Sox' fields, is used for irrigation of the fields and landscaping of the site. The lake uses reclaimed water and is stocked with fish. Mortenson Construction was the general contractor.

Also on W. J. Maloney Plumbing, Heating & Cooling's resume is the Miracle League of Arizona's facilities, where it completed the water, waste and venting, storm water piping and

water-pipe insulation. The League allows children with special needs to play baseball on fields and within facilities that are specially designed, constructed and maintained. The facilities contain rubberized fields, scoreboards and fencing. Hunt Construction Group was the general contractor on this project as well.
